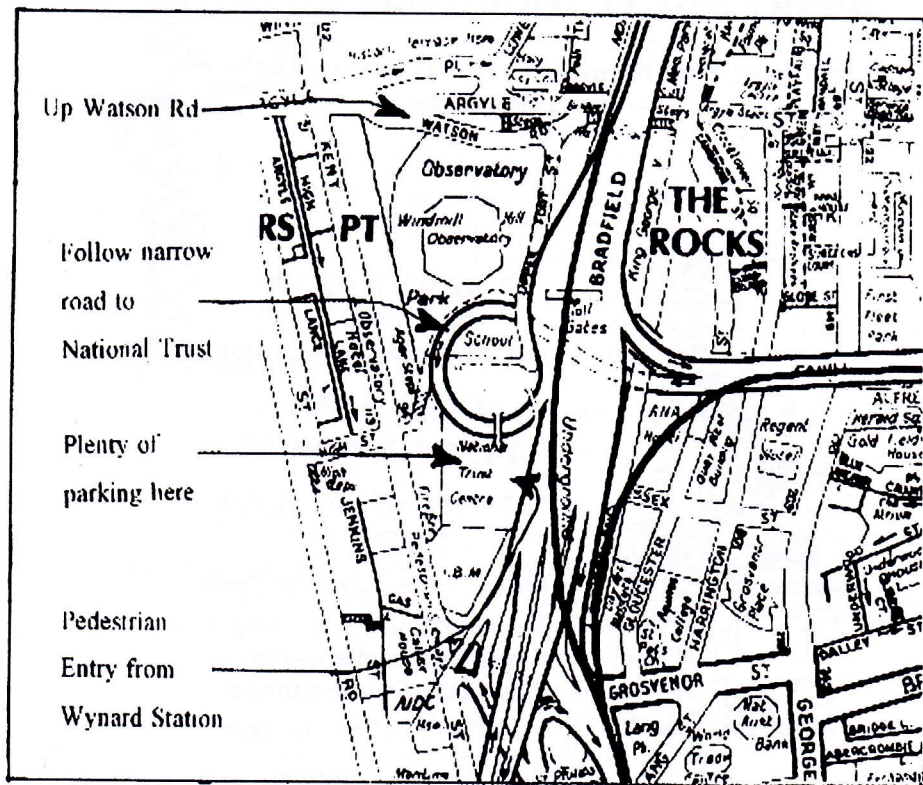

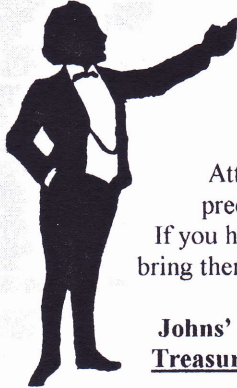

I've read about it but where can I get it?



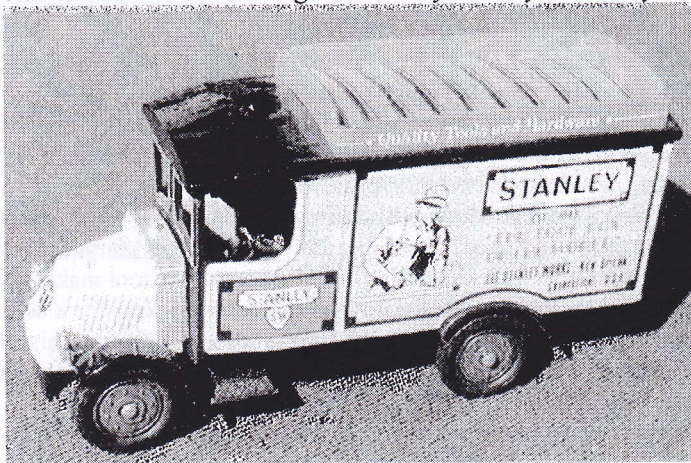

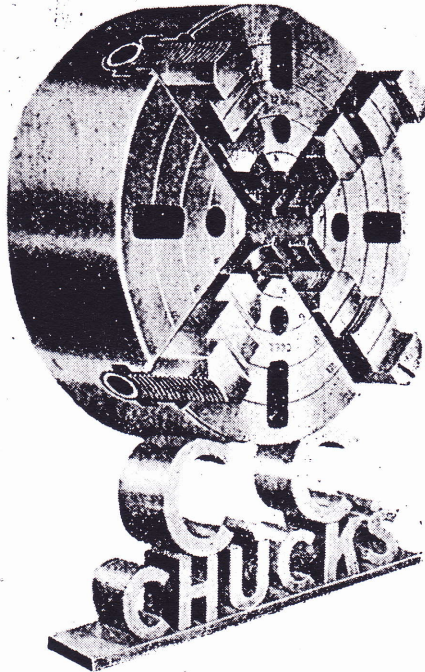

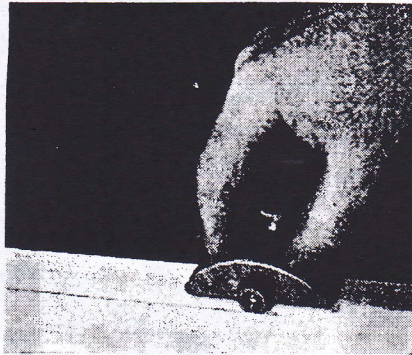
## Surform Marking Gauge.

Ray Gurney has sent the editor a copy of this advertisement from the May 1962 Woodworker magazine.

Were Surform Stornoway House Cleveland Row London and "Surform" manufactured and marketed by Simmonds Aerocessories Great Britain associated in any way?

### **NEW DESIGN OF MARKING GAUGE.**

*The advantage claimed for this tool is that the marker, instead of being just a point, is virtually a long cutting edge parallel with the fence, so that the tool tends to keep up to the edge rather than follow variations of the grain. The marker is in fact in disc form, but does not rotate in use as in a roller gauge. It can, however, be turned to present a fresh cutting position whenever one part becomes dull. The fence is of cast aluminium, and the stem of steel. When not in use the disc can be withdrawn*

**Australian Made.**  
**Surforms.**

The article "Surforms and Shapers" in TTTG newsletter #59 gave a overview of these tools as they were developed and marketed in the United Kingdom. Surforms were also manufactured and sold in Australia. Trevor Semmens' Australian Woodworking Planemakers Second Edition describes Australian Surforms under the entry "Simmonds Aeroaccessories". Semmens states that Surform was manufactured in Ballart Victoria in the early 1960's by Simmonds Aeroaccessories, a subsidiary of Firth Cleveland Pty Ltd. of Wolverhampton England. In 1967 Stanley Works (Great Britain) became the proprietor of the trade mark "Surform". The editor recently acquired two Australian made Surforms from TTTG members Bob and Pat Peak.

One is a block plane type Surform with the embossed lettering **Surform Simmonds Aeroaccessories Pty. Ltd. Ballart Victoria.** The other is a Plane type Surform and is in the original box. This Surform plane has a paper label with the wording **Simmonds Aeroaccessories Pty. Ltd.**

**Thanks Jim.**

There must be a lot of them out there, you know, the tools made by the craftsmen and workers that had little access, either by fortune or distance, to the retailed tools -the tools that are so often overlooked because of their humble appearance.

One such tool arrived in the post the other day, found by Jim Black in Victoria.

Jim is a tradesman trained in the "old school" of joinery which has given him an appreciation of all tools of trade, from the most elegant to the most humble.

Thanks Jim for not overlooking this one.

I think I could confidently classify this tool as a Side Fillister Plane.

Specification of plane.

Body-

Length 13", width 2", height 1<sup>1/2</sup>".

Made from a length of channel iron, cut out on one side to allow the blade to project to the edge of plane body.

Knob-

Brass, unique adaptation of a 1930's door knob.

Handle-

Flattened 1/2" water pipe.

Curved to form a comfortable grip.

Brazed to the body of the plane.

Depth Adjustment-

Possibly inspired by Shelton's patent.

Two serrated nuts are placed either side of a lug that fits into the backing iron slot.

Lateral Lever-

Well made, copied from a Stanley type lever.

Lever Cap-

Possibly a modified manufactured cap.

It has been narrowed with packing pieces brazed to the underside of both edges for strength and appearance.

Blade-

A Stanley SW cutter reduced in width down one side to allow the cutting edge to protrude through the cut-out in the body of the plane.

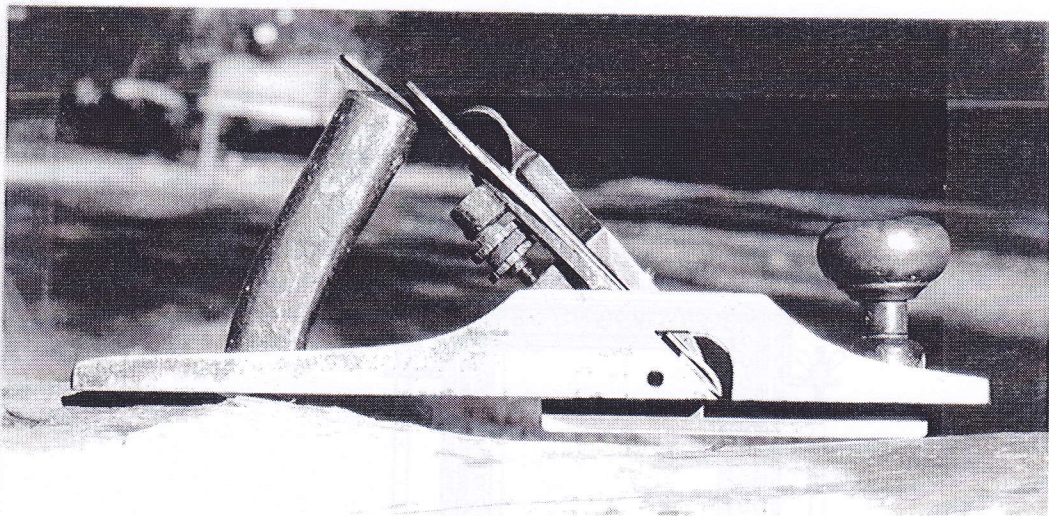
The Guide-

Each side of the body has been drilled and tapped to allow the fitting of the rod and guide from a No. 78.

This plane was no doubt made by a craftsman who fully understood the geometry and function of a plane. The plane is comfortable to hold and in my opinion it compares quite favourably with the Stanley No. 78 and feels more like a Stanley No. 10, perhaps the backing iron facilitates a smoother flow of shaving.

All considered, this plane gives excellent results and is very satisfying to use.

No doubt a product from another anonymous Australian tool maker/ craftsman.

The Committee is planning to represent TTTG at the Canberra Show.

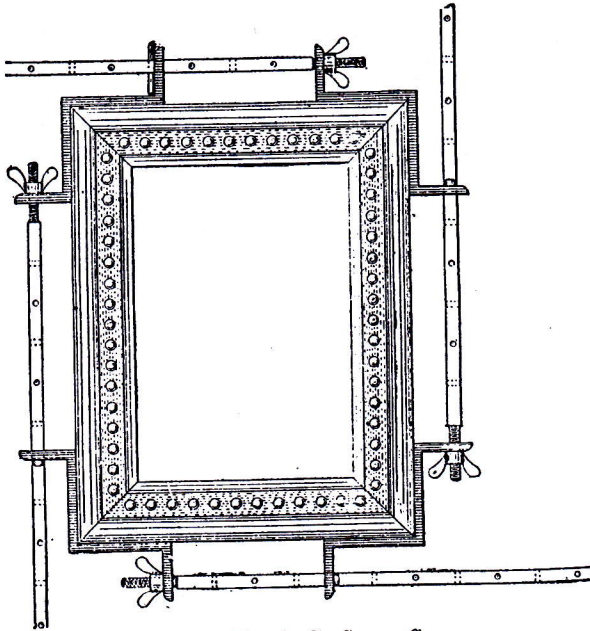

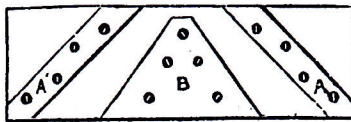

—Plan of Wedge Cramp.



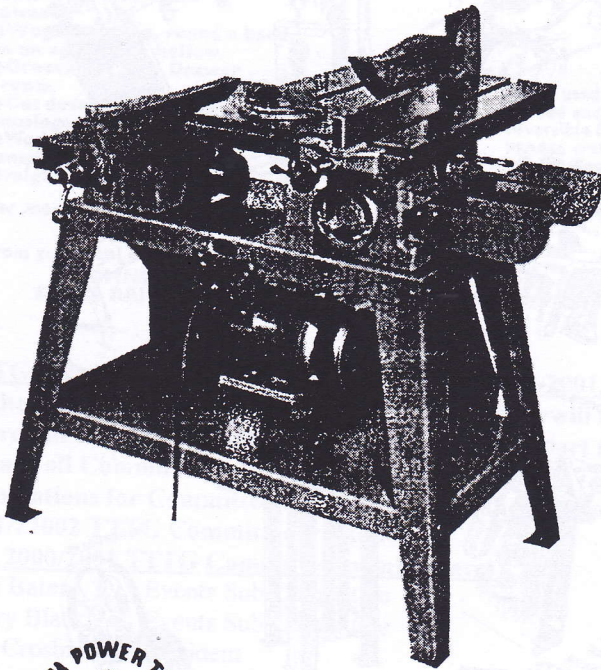

The TTTG Library holds a selection of Atom Distributing Company Price Lists from the 1950s and 1960s.



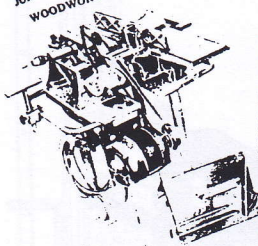

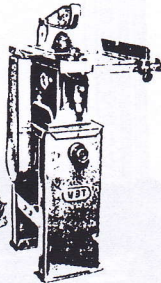

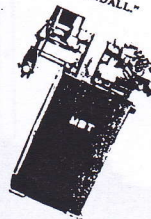

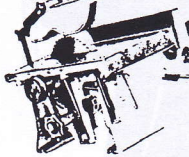

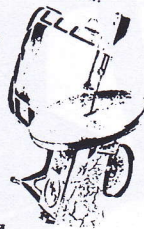

Collectables come in all shapes and sizes, and as I've been collecting tools and things over many years I find among them items delegated to a box or shelf. I refer to give-aways, you know the sort of thing, half a dozen knives with a every tank of petrol.

The ones I found cluttering up my workshop came mainly from engineering firms to promote and advertise their products. I've put number of them together and realise I have a new category of collectable.

Let me describe a few of these. I am holding a pressed brass ashtray with six lips for nesting the cigarette on and impressed into the base is

**JOHN HEINE & Son Ltd. Sydney NSW.**

**Make PRESSES, DIES and MACHINES For SHEETMETAL Working**  
5<sup>1/2</sup>" inches in diameter and a 1/2" deep. I have hand polished it and it looks great.

The next item is a paper weight and is a map of Tasmania. Cast into face is

**ELECT. ZINC Co. CADUIM. AUST. Ltd.**

It is Zinc, a silvery colour and weighs about a 1/2 lb and it is 2" across the centre.

The next one could also be a paper weight and is a perfect replica of an anvil. This one is cast iron and has a chrome plated finish. On one side is **RECORD** and on the other is embossed **Sheffield England**. It weighs about 1<sup>1/2</sup> lb and measures about 5" from bull horn to the heel.

Here is another ashtray made from copper, circular in a bowl shape and has a copper coin soldered to the base. The inscription impressed around the coin reads

**Impression from a Die made by Mathew Boulton at Soho 1804 and used to convert Silver Dollars captured by the English in the Spanish War the image of Carolus 111 being thus Defaced.**

The coin is an English penny with the image of George the third dated 1804.

I have no idea of the year of manufacture but it is quite old.

My next one is a pressed steel shape of an electric drill with a bottle opener forming the inside of the handle. It is marked with the one word **SHER**.

I have a tie-pin 1" wide in the shape of an adjustable spanner with the name **DEMCO**

They were machinery distributors with a large store in Cleveland Street Redfern some years ago, not there now but the building still is I believe.

One giveaway has a nice pun in the advertising. It is a 12" wood rule marked out obviously in inches and printed across the top we have

**A GOOD FOOT RULE. Use "KIWI" BOOT POLISH Every Morning.**

And in very small type **Made in the USA.**

My last one is a treasure that sits on my desk. It is a wooden paper knife. It has a map of the world on the face, one half on one side, the other half on the other side and advertises **THE EASTERN TELEGRAPH Co. Ltd.**

**No.11 THE EASTERN EXTENSION TELEGRAPH Co. Ltd.**

**50 & 11 Old Broad Street, London EC.**

On the handle is printed a Calender for the year 1897. The wood is box and 13<sup>1/2</sup>" long.

Do you have anything of this nature. We would like to hear about it.

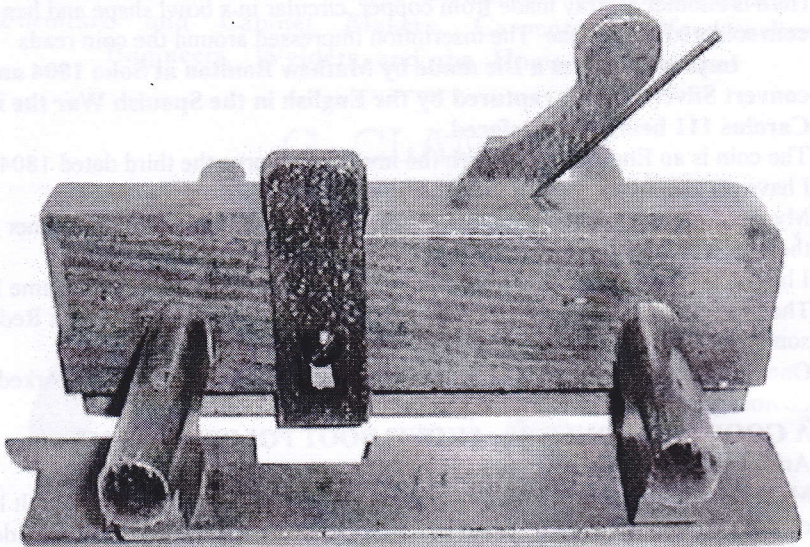

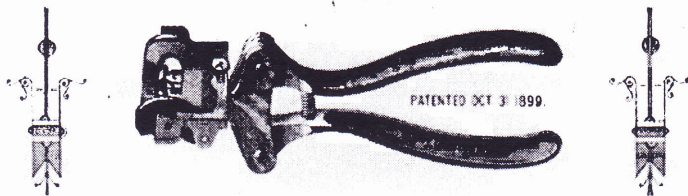

## Book Review.

### "Four centuries of Dutch planes and planemakers"

by Gerrit van der Sterre

Gerrit van der Sterre, born 1926 at Koudekerk aan den Rijn, near Leiden in the Netherlands, is the second son of a carpenter and contractor. He studied constructional engineering at a Haarlem Technical School before working as an engineer with a number of architectural practices.

Following his early retirement in 1984, he was able to devote his time to researching the history of Dutch woodworking planes and their makers. He is a foundation member of Ambacht & Gereedschap Society (Dutch Tools & Trades Society), a member of the Tool and Trades History Society and the Early American Industries Association.

A most striking aspect of the book is that it is written in both Dutch and English. Each page is divided vertically such that the text is English & Dutch in tandem. It works very well with many illustrations (done by Gerrit himself), and photographs fitting in appropriately, with both having English & Dutch captions.

Of interest is the naming of plane types. In translating Dutch names into English & vice versa difficulties are encountered. Gerrit comments thus - "*if...bench plane is translated into bankschaaf a Dutch craftsman would not understand what is meant by the term. On the other hand, the translation of varken into the English equivalent would have little meaning to a British craftsman because he does not normally keep a 'pig' in his tool chest*". Therefore one finds the odd Dutch word used in the English text.

Because of the confusion regarding Dutch plane nomenclature, Gerrit has developed his own for this study. He has divided them into three groups, namely -

1. *brede schaven* - wide planes with an escapement at the top of the stock. Included are, roffel, reischaaf (dutch names), plus panel raising and toothing planes.

2. *smalle schaven* - narrow planes with a side escapement. Included are, rebate, fillister and moulding planes.

3. *diverse schaven* - miscellaneous planes, not included in the above, including ploughs, scrapers and routers.

Historically Dutch wooden planes go back to before 1600, a long history indeed. The main manufacturing locations being Amsterdam, Rotterdam and the Friesland area. They are still being made today although on a much smaller scale than previously. It is noted that Dutch planes have been found in a number of countries, no doubt distributed through immigration.

A country not mentioned is Australia where reasonable numbers of planes have been seen, bought to the country by the many builders and joiners who settled here, particularly after the second world war.

Dated carved planes are most distinctive and are a specifically Dutch phenomena and Gerrit illustrates the basic standardised carved patterns used. This carving is usually found on wide planes in front of the escapement area. The earliest plane of this type is from 1661. Some planes also have quite ornamental shaped handles and totes, sometimes including carving.

A very valuable part of this book is the extensive bibliography, register of makers and marks, as well as a comprehensive index.

This book is truly a well researched, illustrated and assembled book on the Dutch plane making scene past and present. It would be a worthy addition to any tool collector's library.

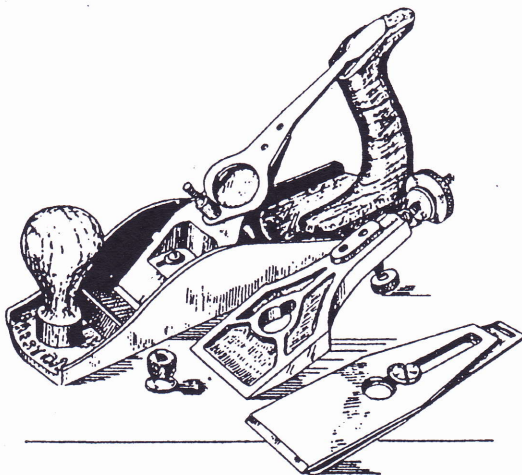

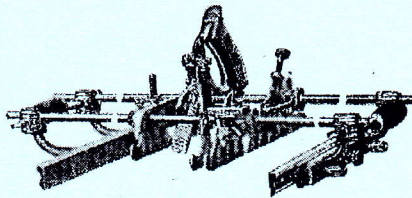
